Seasonality is something that can determine what flowers are available, as well as the price point, not to mention **elevating your wedding flowers** from bog standard to blooming marvellous! For most of the work we do, our client's are happy to allow us to buy in a seasonal mix, which means you get the best quality flowers for the best prices.

Certain flowers have certain windows when they are available, and these windows can change each year owing to growing and weather conditions. On the contrary, there are **certain flowers that you will get all year around** owing to the warmer climates where they are grown such as roses, carnations, veronica, snapdragons, thistles, lisianthus, gerberas and calla lilies to name a few.

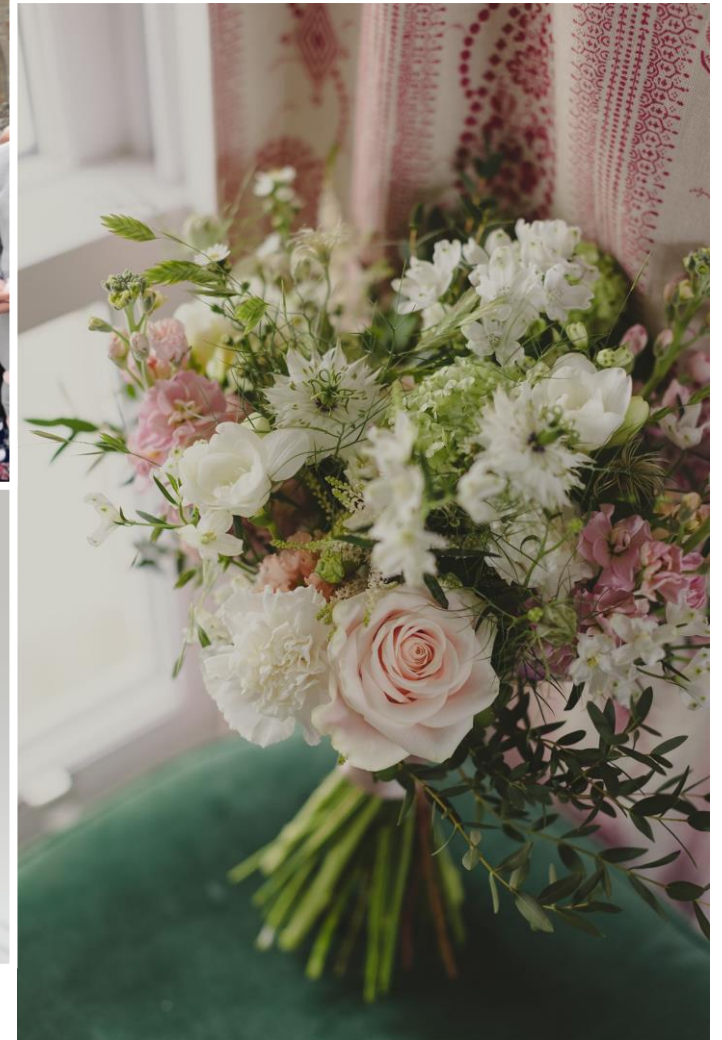

Weddings are gathering pace and so is the emergence of a greater variety of flowers such as ranunculus, peonies, cornflower, nigella and stocks.



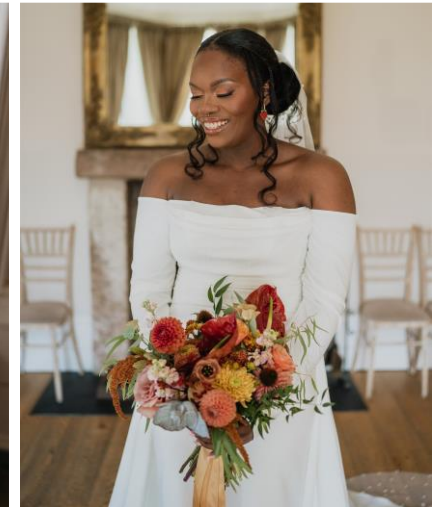
